## Passwords and 2-Factor Authentication Password Tips

- Create unique passwords for the most sensitive accounts
- Change passwords every 6 months
- Make it complicated: Use a method that is unique to you or a generator
- Use 2-factor authentication
- Use a password manager to store complicated unique passwords
- Use one-time passwords on shared computers
